We have increased our regular cleaning, purchased air filtration systems for all of our studios, and invested in a lot of hand sanitizer and face masks.

We are working hard to develop and enhance partnerships in our community. In July, we partnered with the YMCA and we hosted kids from the day camp on site at JSA where they were able to experience art and dance classes. We are also working with Ella Sharp museum on co-hosting an exhibit of world-renowned artist, Frida Kahlo, set for January 2021. Additionally, we are working on strengthening our partnership with the Jackson Symphony Orchestra.

In August (the 5^{th} and 6^{th}), we were able to hold our Fairy Festival virtually on Facebook. If you missed it, you can scroll through our Facebook page and see all of the exciting events that happened over the two days. We had fairy readings, magical dances, and even a couple of fairy crafts. We look forward to being able to have our 2021 Fairy Festival the weekend of April 24 & 25 in person. Finally, I know that everyone is anxiously awaiting updates on the Capital Campaign and our plans for a potential new space. Rest assured, this is the top priority for the JSA Board of Directors and we certainly appreciate your patience as we continue to work diligently on a final decision and plan for JSA's future. A New Season In More Ways Than One

The Fall season is always filled with its own set of emotions: a new start for students, a new breeze in the air, and the anticipation of the holiday seasons that are on their way.

This year is, of course, new territory, but we want to make sure that we at Jackson School of the Arts can remain a beacon of consistency for our students by continuing to provide quality dance, art, and theater classes and experiences to those that need them most.

New Opportunities & Building on Favorites

Even with the challenges that face us this year, we are excited to bring a handful of new classes this Fall.

Our Art program adds a new Sculpture and Design class that has already created some excitement. Our class for age 9 to 13 is already booked up, but we still have room in our younger class for ages 4 to 8. But other newer favorites such as our Cartooning and Illustration and Paint, Pour & Explore also have more room for now.

Our Theater program has expanded this Fall, featuring two classes each for two different age groups. You can read more about those below.

The Dance lineup has stayed rather consistent, but there are many different styles to experience for a variety of ages – including adults!

For those wanting to have a multi-day pre-school experience, we also have our Kids Create program for ages 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 5.

All of our classes are officially underway now, but we still have registration and anyone will be able to join any classes that are not at capacity at any time. (However, some dance classes with recital performance will have cut-off dates)

Small Class Sizes: Safer & More Focused

Of course, we also want to make sure our facilities and classes are still safe and promote community health. We have a number of precautions that we are implementing, but (in addition to masks, hand sanitizer, and distancing) one of the simplest measures we are taking is reduced class sizes.

This Fall, we are only having maximum class sizes of 9 students (or in the case of our early childhood classes, 5 students plus a caretaker for each student). Not only does this help us with social distancing, but it also lets our instructors give more individualized attention to each student. We are hoping this has a great benefit that can serve as a silver lining in this challenging time.

Extra Precautions & Safety Investments

In terms of other precautions we are taking at JSA, We have invested in additional air filtration systems to help cleanse the air and keep our space as safe as possible. We also take student temperatures with a touch-less thermometer upon entry and clean our entire space every night and have wipes and sanitizer for the day.

The teams at the YMCA, Jackson Symphony Orchestra, and Jackson School of the Arts have already been increasing their efforts to reach the children of the Jackson community over the last few years, but the COVID-19 era has motivated us to work even stronger together to keep our kids active, educated, and foster their creativity.

This summer, as we knew kids needed a chance to get out of their homes and expand their experiences, our organizations collaborated on a summer camp program that would provide an amazing variety of fun learning experiences. At the same time, we made sure everyone kept safe distances, stayed cool in the shade, and masked-up, when appropriate.

Our campers enjoyed making music at the Jackson Symphony Orchestra, creating all sorts of masterpieces plus learning dance moves at the Jackson School of the Arts, and hitting a bullseye at YMCA Storer Camps. Not only did the kids learn a lot, but our staff continued to learn more about adapting to our new world while still providing creative education.



The early years are a key point in cognitive development, a time to nurture curiosity and develop self-confidence. Along the way, our instructor, Miss Jode works in a number of color, shape, and composition concepts along the way, laying down a solid foundation of artistic concepts for these young minds.

Not only are these Early Childhood classes an excellent education experience, but they are also a priceless bonding experience between the children and their parents or caretakers. With both "My First Art Class" and "Fun & Fabulous Pre-School Art", one caretaker sits in with the student during class. Its a wonderful opportunity for the kids to share their revelations and accomplishments in the moment and for parents to soak it in (without having to worry about the mess!) and create and capture memories along the way.

While we are taking more precautions during this COVID-19 era, we are still allowing parents/caretakers to join in on the fun in our Early Childhood classes. We are limiting only 5 students into each class session so these caregivers can still continue to make memories together and make our little artists extra comfortable in the classroom.

We also have our Kids Create Pre-School experience for children ages 3 ½ to 5 and is ideal for a child's first class away from home or as a supplement or substitute to traditional preschool programs. Our instructors engage students through a variety of creative experiences including sculpture, painting, drawing, creative movement and music. This program provides social, motor, and creative experiences that excite love for learning through the arts.

Even though we focus a lot on movement and developing physical skills in our dance classes, a significant component of our dance classes is about building confidence in our students. In fact, many of our former students, staff and community members cite their youth dance classes as a major contributor to building the confidence that benefited them later in their lives and careers.

We also realize that it is important for each of our little dancers to have somebody to give them a hug right before class and welcome them back with open arms after a fun-filled lesson. Because of that, even with our COVID-19 precautions, we are allowing one parent/caretaker to accompany each Pre-Ballet I through Pre-Ballet III student.

However, to keep everyone safe, only one adult is allowed to come into the building and observe class. To keep numbers low, we cannot allow siblings to join – Even if school is cancelled, etc...
