JSA was able to have our Fairy Festival in April and I am excited to say that it was a great experience and we heard some excellent feedback from those who attended. Stay tuned for a more expanded ticketed experience next year in the new space as well as some of the free elements we hope to bring back post COVID. We were able to raise over \$45,000 for our low/moderate income students to have access to programming. WE WERE BACK IN PERSON AND SET NEW FUNDRAISING RECORDS

The special thing about Fairy Festival is all the fun and lasting memories made by the children and families that attend. For 14 years we have made the magic of the Fairy Festival, and create what has now become known as a Jackson tradition. We are happy to report that the 2021 Fairy Festival, held in April, was the most successful Fairy Festival in our 20+ year history of the event.

We were able to host over 400 attendees in a safe, socially distanced environment and raise over \$42,000 for the school with the generosity of sponsors and ticket sales. In addition, we partnered with the Interfaith Shelter, Aware Shelter, Big Brothers Big Sisters and David's Promise to spread the magic of the fairy festival to more individuals.
